## Description

The University of the Arts Bremen was founded in 1873 and is one of the oldest and most successful Arts institutions in Germany. It is one of only 2 Arts universities in Germany that teaches both Music and Visual Arts and there is an emphasis on co-operation between disciplines. The Fine Arts faculty is currently located at a former overseas harbour, Speicher XI.

## Surrounding Area

The city of Bremen is located in Northwest Germany almost midway between the German borders with the Netherlands and Denmark. It is one of the largest cities in Germany with a population of over 500,000 and is located entirely on flat plains. This makes it one of the most cycle friendly cities in Germany. The airport is south of the city and easily accessible by public transport (10 minutes on the tram).

## Accommodation

Limited number of places in Student dorms. Private accommodation organised with help from Student assistants. Students have to register in Bremen at local authority.

- Information about English and/or German language skills
- Portfolio
- CV
- Motivation letter
- 1 ID photo
